

**SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER REGARDING GOLF AND FACE COVERINGS MADE
PURSUANT TO DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY
VILLAGE OF DEERFIELD
May 1, 2020**

I, Mayor Harriet E. Rosenthal, do hereby issue the following supplemental emergency order for the Village of Deerfield this 1st day of May, 2020 ("**Supplemental Order**").

Introduction

On March 16, 2020, I issued a Declaration of Emergency pursuant to the authority granted to me by Section 2-137 of "The Municipal Code of the Village of Deerfield, Illinois, 1975," as amended; Section 11-1-6 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-1- 6; and Section 11 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3305/11 to address the health threat posed by the COVID-19 pandemic ("**Declaration**").

The Declaration granted and reserved emergency powers to the Mayor during the pendency of the civil emergency, including the right to issue additional emergency regulations and orders in furtherance of the Declaration.

Since issuance of the Declaration, the corporate authorities of the Village of Deerfield approved and extended the duration of the Declaration. As of the date of this Supplemental Order, the Declaration has been extended through and until May 4, 2020.

In Executive Order No. 2020-10, issued on March 20, 2020, Governor Pritzker directed residents of Illinois to stay at home, subject to limited exceptions, and non-essential businesses to cease operations with limited exceptions. ("**Original Stay-at-Home Order**"). The Original Stay-at-Home Order has been extended through April 30, 2020.

In Executive Order 2020-32 issued on April 30, 2020, Governor Pritzker entered a new order, renewing, modifying, and updating and extending the Original Stay-at-Home Order ("**Updated Stay-at-Home Order**"). The Updated Stay-at-Home Order incorporates several changes and modifications to the Original Stay-at-Home Order, including approval for the playing of golf, but only in accordance with guidelines provided by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity ("**DCEO**").

On April 2, 2020, I issued a supplemental order pursuant to the Declaration, prohibiting at or upon any public place or property the (i) the conduct of any sport or recreational activity using or involving shared equipment, and (ii) group exercise programs with persons who are not members of the same household or residence ("**April 2nd Order**").

On April 21, 2020, I issued a supplemental order pursuant to the Declaration, requiring all persons over the age of five to wear face coverings, with specified limited exceptions ("**April 21st Order**"). The requirements of my April 21st Order are similar to, but not identical to, the face covering provisions of the Updated Stay-at-Home Order.

Additions are bold and double underlined; deletions are struck through.

In light of the Updated Stay-at-Home Order, I have determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to issue a supplemental emergency order as set forth below, clarifying and updating my April 2nd Order and April 21st Order concerning the playing of golf and wearing of face coverings.

In order to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in the Village, and to further protect the residents of the Village from disease and death, and pursuant to the authority set forth in the Declaration, Sections 11-1-6 and 11-20-5 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-1- 6, 11-20-5; and Section 11 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3305/11, I find that it is necessary to issue a supplemental emergency order as set forth below.

Except as expressly provided in this Supplemental Order, nothing in this Supplemental Order modifies or limits the actions and authority previously established by the Declaration or any of the orders that I previously issued pursuant to the Declaration.

Supplemental Order

I hereby direct and order as follows:

A. Golf. My April 2nd Order shall not apply to golf provided that golf is played in strict compliance with the Updated Stay-at-Home Order and the guidelines provided by the DCEO.

B. Face Coverings. Notwithstanding any provision of the Updated Stay-at-Home Order to the contrary:

1. Section A of the April 21st Order is amended to be and read as follows:

“A. Face Covering Required. Except as provided in Subsection C of this Supplemental Order, all persons over the age of ~~five~~ two are required to wear face covering to include their nose and mouth made of cloth or other material that is reasonably designed and made to inhibit, filter, or restrict the breath, sneeze, cough, or other exhaling from one’s nose and mouth (as further provided and described in Subsection D of this Supplemental Order) while engaging in the following activities:

1. Working in or patronizing Essential Businesses and Operations (as defined in Governor Pritzker’s Stay-at-Home Order) that are open to the public or when employees have contact with the public, which businesses include, without limitation, grocery stores, restaurants, hardware and supply stores, financial institutions, laundry services, essential government functions, and any home or curbside delivery carriers.
2. Engaging in essential activities such as shopping for necessary supplies and services, seeking medical

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supplies or medication, visiting a health care professional.

3. Working in or visiting an indoor construction site.
4. Performing landscape services.
5. Riding in public transportation, taxis, or ride share vehicles.
- 6. When in indoor common areas of a multi-unit residential, non-residential, or mixed-use building, including, without limitation, elevators, hallways, lobbies, multi-purpose rooms, and parking garages.**
- 7. When in outdoor common areas of a multi-unit residential, non-residential, or mixed-use property, including, without limitation, common patios, decks, and parking lots, when social distancing of at least six feet from persons who are not members of the same household or residence cannot be maintained. For the purposes of this Section A.7, "members of the same household or residence" shall mean a group of people, whether related or unrelated, who occupy the same dwelling unit on a full-time basis and utilize common cooking, eating, and sanitation facilities."**

2. The April 21st Order is amended to add a new Section F, which shall be and read as follows:


"F. A sign shall be posted in the lobbies or entrance ways of all multi-unit residential, non-residential, and mixed-use buildings notifying unit owners, tenants, and their guests of the requirements of Section A.6 and A.7 of this Order."

This Supplemental Order will take effect on Saturday, May 2, 2020 at 12:01 am, and run concurrently with the term of the Declaration of Civil Emergency unless rescinded or superseded by my order or a majority vote of the corporate authorities at any regular or emergency meeting thereof.



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
