BILLING & PAYMENT INFORMATION

The Village of Deerfield will bill you quarterly, along with your water/utilities bill for regular collection. Additional requested services are paid directly to LRS.

SHREDDING EVENT

Consistent with past years, LRS will provide the Village an annual "Shred" event, which will allow Deerfield residents to safely purge and shred old documents. Please check the Village's website periodically for more information.

PORTABLE RESTROOMS AND DUMPSTERS

LRS has expanded our temporary services division to create an easier customer experience, whether for a large construction site or a homeowner with a renovation or clean-out project. As the second largest portable toilet business in Illinois, LRS provides safe and sanitary restrooms for any occasion, from construction remodels, to large events and outdoor weddings.



Additionally, LRS holds over 20 years of roll-off dumpster experience, and we guarantee service operations will be timely and above expectations. An LRS representative will work with you to select the appropriate box so that your project runs smoothly.

MISSED COLLECTION PICK UP

Please contact LRS within 24 hours at **844.NEED.LRS** to notify LRS Customer Service your waste material was not collected. If you would prefer to email, please send your name, phone number, full address and specifically what material was not collected (garbage, recycle, organics, yard waste, large item, etc.) to **Service@LRSrecycles.com**.

Improperly prepared materials placed for collection will not be collected. LRS will tag the items left behind for the resident, communicating the non-compliance preventing the collection.

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

Service will be delayed by one day if a holiday falls Sunday through Friday. If the holiday falls on a Saturday, your service day will not be delayed. The following holiday's may impact your service day:

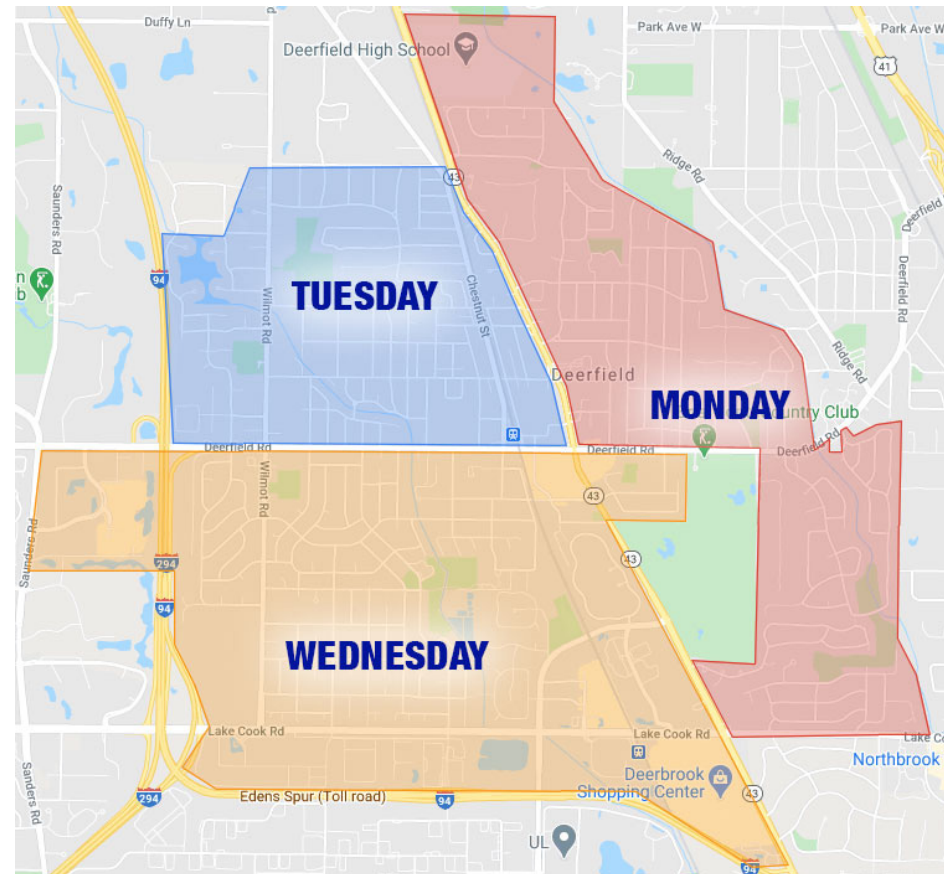

SERVICE DAYS

Deerfield is serviced on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Should your service day be changed, you will be notified of the new day by a sticker that will be placed on your cart, as well as the inset map on this mailer.

On your regular collection day, we ask that you have your carts out from 7AM-7PM. Per Village ordinance, carts should not be placed at the curb earlier than sundown the night before your collection day.

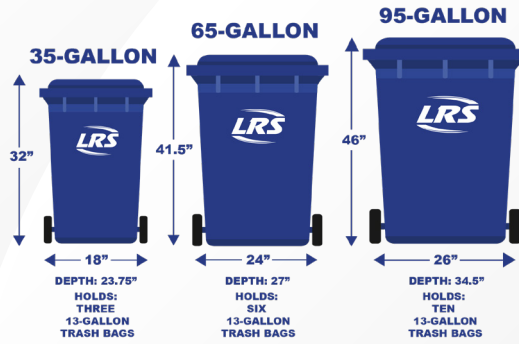

WASTE, RECYCLING & ORGANICS CARTS

WASTE (GARBAGE) COLLECTION (UNLIMITED)

You will be provided one garbage cart by LRS, which will be serviced on a weekly basis. Cart size options: 35-gallon, 65-gallon and 95-gallon (95-gallon will be the default size). One "bulk" item a week may be placed out for collection at no additional charge. Additional bulk items that are placed out for collection require a yard waste sticker. Please note this may result in a service charge.



Additional carts may be rented. Please contact LRS for pricing.

RECYCLING COLLECTION (UNLIMITED)

You will be provided one recycling cart by LRS, which will be serviced on a weekly basis. Cart size options: 35-gallon, 65-gallon and 95-gallon (95-gallon will be the default size). Your recycling service will continue to be defined as single-stream, which means most clean and non-contaminated household items will be considered recyclable.

A list of acceptable and unacceptable items is included in this mailer. (Please note: pizza boxes, plastic bags of any kind and textiles / clothing are not acceptable recycling items.) Residents may place out as much accepted recycling items as they wish each week for collection. Overflow recycling materials do not need to be in a container, but large cardboard boxes must be broken down in order to be collected.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Similar to your waste and recycling service, LRS will provide standard collection of properly placed yard waste material on a weekly basis. This service is seasonal, and will run from April 1 through the week of December 15. Yard waste stickers will be needed for bag service, and may be purchased at the same retailers that currently sell stickers.

All yard waste must be placed in a proper receptacle, not to exceed 50lbs in weight. Paper kraft bags may also be used. User-owned cans should not exceed 35-gallons, and should be clearly marked as "Yard Waste." Cans and kraft bags that contain excessive amounts of soil, dirt or earth may go uncollected. LRS will also take bundles of sticks, twigs and branches that are no more than 4' in length, and 18" in diameter. Bags, bundles, paper kraft bags and user owned cans require a yard waste sticker.

Your yard waste collection day will be the same as your waste and recycling collection day. All items and material should be placed out for collection by 7AM.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES

LRS FOOD WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAM

LRS is pleased to offer Deerfield residents the ability to place organics material and food waste out for weekly collection. Food waste in particular, accounts for approximately 20% of all waste that ends up in landfills. With the organics/ food waste option, Deerfield residents will now play a larger role in reducing this type of waste and help reduce greenhouse gases in the process.

Each single-family home has one 35-gallon cart to be used for organics (food waste/ yard waste). This service is provided as part of your regular monthly charges.

This year-round service will take place on the same day as your waste and recycling service. For a more detailed guideline on proper food waste and organics steps, and acceptable items, please visit SWALCO.org (Solid Waste Agency of Lake County) for more information.

BULK ITEMS

One "bulk" item may be placed out for collection each week at no additional cost. "Bulk" items are defined as items too large to fit into your waste cart, and 50lbs in weight or less. "Bulk" items do not include "white" goods (appliances like refrigerators, washing machines, etc) or electronic waste, certain types of construction debris (concrete, stone, masonry etc.), dirt, tree stumps and engines, among other items.

For additional "bulk" collection outside of the weekly limit of one item, please contact LRS to schedule service. Each additional item will be charged based on the item.

CHRISTMAS TREES

One Christmas tree will be collected at no charge curbside through the month of January. This will include real trees only, which are free of chemicals, sprays and decorations.



WHITE GOODS

As part of the Village's contract with LRS, residents will be allowed to schedule the removal of white goods on mutually agreeable days, at no charge. "White" goods are generally defined as appliances like refrigerators, washers and dryers, ovens, but include other items as well.

ELECTRONIC WASTE

Residents will be able to drop off an unlimited amount of electronic waste at a designated location twice per year. Please check the Village's website periodically for more information.



RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

PAPER

- NO used paper plates or pizza boxes, fluorescent paper (they contaminate the paper stream with food, dye, or plastic coating). If pizza box top is clean you can tear it off and recycle it.
- NO paper towels, tissues, or napkins, which are not recyclable because the fibers are too small to reuse (please compost them with kitchen food scraps if possible).
- NO Shredded Paper – Loose shredded paper causes major sorting problems in the Recycling Facilities.
- NO frozen food boxes, which are made of a hybrid of paper and plastic, and are not wanted by paper mills.
- NO paper cups, which are also made of a hybrid of paper and plastic rendering them unrecyclable.

ALUMINUM CANS AND FOIL

Aluminum cans, Aluminum foil & Pie plates & trays



CARTONS

Milk, Soup, and Juice cartons & boxes



STEEL/TIN CANS

Food cans and lids, Metal paint cans and lids & Empty aerosol cans

NO utensils, propane tanks, wire hangers, or small appliances



GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS

All colors are accepted

NO window or auto glass, bakeware, ceramics, mirrors, light bulbs, coffee pots or drinking glasses



PLASTIC CONTAINERS

Plastic bottles, Plastic tubs & Plastic jugs

- NO plastic bags or plastic film (plastic wraps, sandwich bags, freezer bags, tarps).
- NO plastic utensils or plates (plastic wraps, sandwich bags, freezer bags, tarps), cups, lids or straws.
- NO candy wrappers, cereal bags, potato chip bags, or snack bags.
- NO empty motor oil, pesticide, or chemical bottles.
- NO Styrofoam, polystyrene (do not put in curbside bin).
