Baxter Bridge Proposed PUD: Unable to Meet Standard set in Subsection D, 2(c)(2)

To Board Members:

Deerfield's Zoning Ordinance is part of the record. Stipulations and conditions can be set by the Planning Commission according to Subsection 12.09-D,1(b). The Commission must make a recommendation to approve or deny rezoning within 60 days of the close of the hearing. ***Our property is within 250 feet of the Baxter Bridge proposed planned development.***

The burden of proof is always on the party that seeks rezoning. Subsection 12.09-D, 2(c)(2) of the PUD Standards protects our neighborhoods. This subsection obligates the proposal's advisors, consultants, and creators to effectively demonstrate that the proposal meets the burdens in the ordinance. The proposal omits evaluation additional known toxic emissions generated by the proposed distribution facility. It is still unclear whether higher accumulations or concentrations endanger the health, safety and welfare of our neighborhood due to a much more congested trucking corridor.

Unlike traffic patterns, the parties omit comparable computer-generated models to assess decibel, toxic emission, and effluent levels. Reasonably derived data could be presented to assess the foreseeable byproducts and proposed abatement. The Clavinia Subdivision is currently zoned as residential, but within 250 feet of the proposed PUD. The environmental impact of these indirect or direct effects are omitted. Therefore, the proposed PUD plan seemed unable to meet the burden imposed by subsection D, 2(c)(2).

The Commission may include such stipulation or conditions ***as deemed necessary for the protection of the public interest.*** Unfortunately, it seems unclear how these stipulations or conditions can be effectively enforced against an empowered Bridge Industries.

As suggested in previous comments, what seem likely effects on the community are omitted from the proposed Plan. Deerfield residents are impacted by damage done to nearby communities, hotels, and recreational areas like Ryerson Conservation area. Some public preserves are not considered adjacent, so no effort to express concern can be undertaken due to Lake County policies according to a representative at Ryerson.

Section 12.09-D, 2(c) codifies proposed Planned Unit Development Standards. Bridge Industrial must overcome these presumptions against rezoning. It is obligated to do so within its proposal for rezoning ***It may include factors, but this does not diminish the primary purpose. This ordinance was purposely enacted to prevent damage to the community, neighborhood, surrounding property. The municipal intent of this ordinance seems unquestionable. "Modifications" are not meant to be broad repeals of this ordinance.***

The three most significant elements within the ordinance seem noticeably neglected in the proposal. Many factors involving health, safety, and welfare are relatively

unaddressed by the Baxter Bridge proposal. These inadequacies merit against a favorable recommendation.

Bridge Industries chose to omit meaningful analysis and evaluations of factors meaningful to its neighbors. This, in spite of the legal burdens placed upon its proposal. A decision was made to do so as a matter of discretion and risk. There is an omission of an evaluation of the foreseeable concerns of neighbors.

What will be the short- and long-term impacts of the diesel fuel, effluents, and noise emission upon our community. How will Bridge effectively abate and/or prevent the cumulative effects of pollution?

The staff and children who attend Caruso Junior High, South Parks, and Wilmot Schools deserve an answer. Those who use nearby outdoor recreational facilities and swimming pools deserve answers. The numerous other institutions and residences ought to know. These, among other topics, seem incomplete or entirely omitted from the proposal by design. The environmental impact in its proposed rezoning for numerous gargantuan distributions centers seems tremendous.

The Baxter Bridge proposed Planned Unit Development ***has yet to meet its burden*** to sustain a favorable recommendation. It is unable to prove that the proposed rezoning ***will not be significantly or materially detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, or general welfare of the community.***

The proposed PUD's rezoning plan has the burden to prove that the PUD fulfills the standards contained in 12.09-D-2(c). That is, subsections one through six to the satisfaction of the Plan Board based upon its proposal. The property seems ill suited for this sort of industrial use without further analysis.

Our neighborhood sincerely believes that the Planning Board, along with the Trustees, will take our comments into consideration. The community has responded with comments and materials to support its concerns. This request for an unfavorable outcome is not only righteous, but it is required under the ordinance.

## PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS

Deerfield Zoning Ordinance

Article 12.09-D, 2(c) Required Findings

A Planned Unit Development ***shall not be recommended for approval*** unless the Plan Commission shall find the following:

(1) Effect on Community

That the proposed Planned Unit Development ***will not be significantly or materially detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety or general welfare of the community.*** This ***shall include*** consideration of the impact of the development upon physical development, tax base, and economic well-being of the Village.

(2) Effect on Neighborhood

That the proposed Planned Unit Development ***will not be injurious*** to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted nor will it diminish or impair property values within the neighborhood.

(3) Effect on Development of Surrounding Property

That the proposed Planned Unit Development ***will not impede*** the normal and orderly development and improvement of the surrounding property.

(4) Adequacy of Utilities and Facilities

That the applicant has demonstrated that adequate sewer and water, access roads, drainage and other necessary facilities are present or will be provided.

(5) Adequacy of Ingress and Egress

That the applicant has demonstrated that ***adequate means*** of ingress and egress designed to handle the traffic contemplated ***are present or will be provided.***

(6) Conformity to Regulations

That the proposed Planned Unit Development meets all the regulations of this Ordinance except as such regulations may in each instance be modified by the Board of Trustees.
